INTRODUCTION

Maharaja Ranjit Singh College of Professional Sciences, Indore affiliated to Devi Ahilya University, Indore offers various UG and PG courses like B.Com., B.Sc., BBA, BA, BCA, M.Sc., M.Com., Ph. D. Chemistry. 2158 students are studying in the college in the academic session 2020-2021. The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) of the college has continuously been working on improving the quality of college facilities for the betterment of students. Therefore, a feedback form was circulated amongst all the student of the college. The feedback form is also available on the college website (http://www.mrscindore.org/student-feedback.php). This report focuses on the analysis of feedback forms received from the students.

DATA COLLECTION AND ANALYSIS

An effort was made to receive feedback from all the students who are studying in the college. For this purpose, a google form was created and sent to students. A total of 262 responses were received from the student's community. The analysis of feedback forms was performed using statistical tools like percentage, pie chart and bar graphs.







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FEEDBACK ON COLLEGE

The feedback form was circulated amongst all the students from various courses of the college. Amongst 262 responses received, 94.1% of students strongly feel that the overall college environment is conductive and good for learning and only 1.9% students were not happy about the overall college atmosphere. Majority (92.4%) of the students strongly agree that there is adequate number of classrooms in the college and the classrooms are well maintained and clean. This means that the college atmosphere is healthy and students enjoy coming to college and takes interest in learning.










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FEEDBACK ON TEACHERS

An effort was made to access the student feedback on teachers of the college. For this, questions like teacher's subject knowledge, their teaching method, their sincerity towards completion of syllabus and their behavior towards students were asked.

It was observed that 96.5 % of the students strongly agree that the teaching method adopted by the teachers is good. Maximum students believe that the faculty members in the college have good subject knowledge and they are cooperative. Out of 262 responses, 96.5% students responded that the teachers complete the prescribed syllabus on time. Thus, the college provides well experienced and polished faculties for the guidance and upliftment of the students.










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
FEEDBACK ON LABORATORIES AND LIBRARY

The responses of students regarding the laboratory and library facilities of the college were recorded from the feedback forms. It was found that 86.7% students are completely satisfied with the number of laboratories present in the college, while 13.3% students feel that there should be more laboratories in the college. Majority of the students were also completely satisfied with the number of equipments, glasswares and chemicals in the laboratories and they agree that all the laboratories of the college are well maintained and spacious. The students also agree that the lab staff is extremely cooperative and helpful.

Similarly feedback on library and library staff was also recorded and analyzed. More than 80% of the students said that there is ample number of books available in the library according to their prescribed syllabus and only few students feel that there should be more number of books in the library. Also, the students were happy that library staff is kind and cooperative.

Laboratories and library are essential part of an institute and is a requisite for superior learning and skill development in students. This college provides well equipped laboratories for practical learning approach and the library is loaded with reputed books of international and national origin for conceptual learning of the students.












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FEEDBACK ON COLLEGE FACILITIES

The students' response on facilities of the college like cleaning of washrooms, availability of drinking water, organizing of cultural events, educational tours and guest lectures and presence of sports facilities was recorded. The feedback forms were analyzed and it was found that more than 80% students were contented regarding the facilities provided by the college. It was observed that 85.3% of the students were satisfied with the sports facilities available in the college. The students are assured that clean drinking water is available throughout the campus and washrooms are always clean and maintained hygienically. Thus, the college offers safe and hygienic campus for the students and follows the protocols for Covid-19 safety measures. Most of the students are happy with the number of cultural events and educational tours organized by the college. These events help in providing them platform to show and enhance their extra-curricular skills, hence helping them in overall grooming and personality development. Besides, students also witness various expert lectures organized from time to time to develop their additional knowledge. The students also feel that office staff of the college is helpful and supportive.











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Observations and Recommendations on Feedback of Students

Following observations and recommendations were noted after carefully analyzing the feedback forms received from the current students.

- It was observed that 95% students were happy about the overall college atmosphere. It was recommended that the campus and classrooms should be cleaned on regular basis.
- It was observed that 95% of the students were satisfied by the quality and teaching of the faculty members of the college. To further enhance the quality of education, all the teachers were recommended to participate in faculty development programs for improving their knowledge and skills.
- All the teaching departments of the college were notified to conduct regular meetings and discussion for resolving issues raised by the students.
- 4. The feedback forms indicated that more than 80% of the students were satisfied with the laboratory and library facility provided by the college. The laboratory departments were recommended to purchase new equipments and chemicals





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
TEACHERS FEEDBACK REPORT

The IQAC committee of the college ensures in uplifting college facilities for the benefit of students. In order to obtain feedback on the curriculum and college facilities, a google form was created and circulated among the faculty members of the college. A total of 34 feedback responses were obtained on different aspects such as designing of the syllabus, timely coverage of syllabus in the allotted time, academic environment of the college, adequate facilities for staff members in the college etc. 82.4% of the teachers agreed that the syllabus is designed in a way to inculcate scientific temper, democratic, moral, social and spiritual values in the minds of learner and they are able to cover the syllabus in the allotted time. The faculty members also agree that the curriculum is designed to promote student centric methods, such as experiential learning, participative learning and problem solving methodologies for enhancing learning experiences. All the faculty members were happy and conductive regarding the college administration and department officials. 94.1% teachers agreed that the college library has adequate and relevant books of their discipline. All faculty members also agreed that the college provides adequate funding and support to faculty members for upgrading their skills and qualifications. Majority of the teachers were positive regarding infrastructural facilities of the college such as staffrooms, IT centre, reading rooms etc. The overall analysis of the teachers' feedback reflects sufficient availability of teaching-learning facilities in the college.









Count of 3. The timely coverage of syllabus is possible in the allotted number of teaching hours.




Count of 12. The college library has adequate and relevant books in my subject and purchases them in time.




Court of 17 Infrastructural facilities such as staff rooms, class rooms, tolets are available in the department.

Count of 13. I have freedom to adopt new techniques/ strategies of teaching and taking assessment of students.










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
ALUMNI FEEDBACK REPORT



























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FEEDBACK RESPONSE FROM THE ALUMNI









- Tentative schedule for CCE and Internal Examinations has to be prepared and submitted.
- All faculty members should be promoted to use ICT tools during lectures.
- Actions taken as per the feedback of stakeholders.
- Effective implementation of strategic plan.
